V. Support Service

V.A. Facility Update

John Eisenhower provided the school board with a written report on a new fan motor for the oven, bus issues, working on the remodeling of the old offices, and working on summer projects.

Dr. Prososki noted that due to the issues at the federal level and the tariff war, the air conditioning project will not start until the middle or the end of June now. He is hopeful that the project will still be complete before school starts, but everything is a disaster at the federal level. In addition, the architect decided to make an addendum, and add Dens-Deck to the roof project over the Jr./Sr. High School gym.

V.B. Personnel Items

At the elementary school, especially in the primary grades, we are seeing an increased number of students that are struggling to regulate themselves and their emotions. Dr. Prososki noted that in his person opinion, this has been caused by (1) lost socialization during the pandemic, (2) busier parents/parents that struggle with basic parenting skills, and (3) stimulation from screen time. As Albert Einstein said... Insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results. With that being said, Southern is planning on adding another day for the ESU 5 mental health counselor in our district. Next school year, they will spend 1.5 days at the Elementary School and 0.5 days at the Jr./Sr. High School.

VI.B. Elementary Principal's Report

The elementary principal reported on the following items: current enrollment figures, presented a capstone project to the NAESP leadership team, 14 students attended kindergarten step up day, school resource deputy presenting to 5th and 6th graders on social media safety, band concert, NSCAS incentive day, upcoming field trips, and kindergarten graduation.

Kane did not that Jenilee Wright may not be able to get out of her contract with Beatrice Public Schools, pending they cannot find a suitable replacement for the fall. If this is indeed the case, Southern may have to look at having one section of kindergarten next school year.

The secondary principal reported on the following items: current enrollment figures, last day of school, alternative school update, senior scholarship interview day, Honors Night, JAG, and graduation.

VI.D. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Prososki went over the annual preschool advisory meeting minutes, and he went over a draft of the assessment calendar for the 2025-2026 school year. Dr. Prososki said that Dr. Moon stated that she couldn't complete the budget with all of the changes that have been made in the past years, and he said he would be willing to complete the budget for Southern for a fee. He noted that the Hastings board said he could spend up to 2 days to complete this task. The district could also go with someone else, and they would charge a lot higher fee. Dr. Prososki noted that if LB 682/AM 566 passes, it prohibits superintendents from receiving any other income besides their school salary, hence he could not complete the budget for Southern. Dr. Prososki noted that he does not know how it is legal to dictate what someone does in their free time, and why should a superintendent go to jail or be fined for mowing their neighbor's yard for a measly \$20? Dr. Prososki noted that Perry Law firm said that superintendents are the most hated profession in the state of Nebraska, and LB 682/AM 566 validates this. Next, Dr. Prososki gave the school board an update on LB 645, in which the state plans to raid the teacher retirement account to help fund the self-inflicted budget crisis at the state level that was caused by the income and corporate tax cuts. Dr. Prososki said that he was selected to pilot a Nebraska Collaborative Learning Network course put out by NCSA, NDE, and higher education institutes. From here, Dr. Prososki went over the presenters for next school year, and he gave the school board an update on the QCPUF bond. Lastly, Dr. Prososki noted that the district is in an outstanding financial spot, and the district has the ability to construct a practice gym at the elementary school within our current budget through a seven-year lease purchase agreement. The school board will ultimately need to decide if they want to go this route. The district cash reserves have increase by \$4.5 million dollars over the last 7-years, and the school board said they would also like to add a preschool classroom, and build a track. Dr. Prososki said he would have preliminary numbers for the June school board meeting regarding some future facility projects.

Dr. Prososki noted that school districts in Nebraska are required by law to have a Student Fees hearing. Dr. Prososki said that no changes have been made to Policy 5045: Student Fees over the past couple of years. These are also the same fees that local ESU 5 schools utilize in our area. Dr. Prososki said that Policy 5045: Student Fees serves as a placeholder for sponsors or coaches that may want to complete some extra activities during the school year. The majority of the fees in Policy 5045: Student Fees are not imposed on students, and in many cases, they can elect if they want to pay, for example, a \$30 fee to take their laptop home with them during the school year or not.
